



SAHA Inspire Spelling Beeth General Report 2025

As part of its activities to promote education and women's excellence, African Solidarity for Haiti (SAHA) organized in July 2025 the first edition of its Spelling Contest, aimed at students from the 2nd to the 6th fundamental year. This event took place at the Lycée Dumarsais Estime in Hinche, and brought together several dozen talented young girls around a common goal: To develop language skills, encourage self-confidence, rigor and reward school work.

Designed in an atmosphere that is both rigorous, friendly and inclusive, the competition was structured around four main phases:

- Phase 1 (Selection): July 18, 2025
- Phase 2 (Semi-final): July 20, 2025
- Phase 3 (Pre-final): July 25, 2025
- Phase 4 (Grand Final): July 26, 2025 (*originally scheduled for July 27, but rescheduled due to an official police review*)

PARTICIPATION AND ORGANIZATION

Twenty (20) students registered for this first edition, from different schools in the municipality. Apart from the first, each phase made it possible to highlight the best performers, based on a strict evaluation (10 points per word, on precise criteria of pronunciation, spelling, confidence and respect for time). That is to say, each candidate chose a word from a small box designed according to her level, gave it to the jury who, in turn, read it clearly, define it in a simple way and put it in a sentence. In return, the candidate repeats it and spells it correctly.



The event was able to count on:

- The exemplary mobilization of parents, especially those of the parental sub-committee (*reception, secretariat, logistics*)
- The professionalism of the juries, all chosen for their competence and impartiality
- The BONNÉLUS family, who generously lent a sound system
- A collective impetus for the decoration of the space, which made it possible to create a warm and unifying atmosphere

SEQUENCE OF PHASES

Phase 1 (Selection): *July 18, 2025*

In this phase, 17 candidates out of 20 registered were evaluated on 5 words to be spelled in front of an impartial jury composed of Mrs. Juve-laure JOSEPH and Mr. Enardy Rolando JEAN. The evaluation was based on 10 points per word according to several criteria: pronunciation, accuracy, confidence and respect for time. This phase made it possible to test the basics: reading, concentration, spelling and adaptation. All candidates are qualified for the previous phase.

Phase 2 (Semi-final): *July 20, 2025*

Based on the same criteria and approaches, the commitment and tension were palpable. The level was raised, and some candidates brilliantly surprised the jury composed of Mrs. Milca ALY and Mr. Roosevelt PIERRE. At the end of this stage, 14 girls reached the pre-final.

Phase 3 (Pre-final): *July 25, 2025*

Although the criteria and procedures are unchanged, the tests have reached a more demanding level with the jury composed of Mrs. Claudine ÉTIENNE and Mr. Enardy Rolando JEAN. After this intense stage, only 8 candidates were selected for the grand final.





Phase 4 (Grand Final): July 26, 2025

Postponed for a day to make way for an official police exam, the final took place in an exceptional atmosphere. The space was beautifully decorated, with acoustics illustrated by 4 candidates, adorned with the acronym SAHA symbolizing the initiatory spirit, games, music, dances, and even a singer among the finalists. It was a festive and moving moment, welcomed by the whole community.

RESULTS AND AWARDS

Of the 20 participants in the competition, 8 reached the grand final. And among these 8 finalists, the ones who occupy the first three places are:

- **1st Place** : DORÉLUS Sabentina Emmaïka (3rd A.F., 9 years old)

Receives a full scholarship up to the 9th year of foundation, subject to maintaining a minimum average of 7.50 at each school check.

- **2nd Place** : HILLAIRE Samirrantzney (3rd A.F., 10 years old)

Receives a complete school kit (*suitcase, notebooks, geometry box, pens, pencils and sizes, erasers...*)

- **3rd Place** : LOUIS Djayshanah (4th A.F., 10

years old) Also receives a complete school kit.

It should also be noted that all registered candidates, jury members and members of the parental subcommittee received AHS certificates.
